COLWOOD TRANSPORTATION FAST FACTS

Trips by active transportation are growing 5% of trips in 2011 grew to 14% in 2022

- Average monthly Goose & Painter Trail users 22,514 Goose + 12,141 Painter Trail
- Daily vehicle trips are down to 2.6 per person a decrease of about 10% since 2011
- Most morning trips stay within the community 41% stay in Colwood, 2/3 in West Shore

1/3 of commute trips are 30 minutes or longer commutes are longer compared to CRD

40% of households own just one vehicle or less whereas 21% have three or more vehicles

Owning fewer vehicles is a trend in Colwood 1.9 vehicles per household, a decrease of 5% from 2011





- Bridge, and a Waterfront Walkway. Data shows more people are choosing active transportation for some trips and taking fewer trips overall with an increase in working from home.

Data and best practices are driving the plan

- Current travel data for mode choice, trip patterns, origins-destinations and vehicle ownership.
- Traffic Model data to understand the impact of potential development and identify street network improvements, intersection upgrades, or road widening required for safe, efficient movement.

on a Transportation Plan update

What is a Transportation Master Plan?

The plan provides the vision and guidance to inform how we invest in improving mobility to ensure Colwood offers safe, efficient transportation options.

A lot has changed since the 2015 transportation plan

- Our population has increased by almost 20%, with most growth in South Colwood + Colwood Corners.
- The community-led 2018 Official Community Plan highlighted new priorities for residents.
- Upgrades are ongoing: Latoria roundabout, sidewalk projects, intersection updates, Gallopoing Goose

Well-being

Making it easier for residents to walk or cycle for some trips is one way Council works to support well-being.

- Complete street design standards to ensure that all street network improvements provide benefit across a range of travel options.
- Updated pedestrian and cycling network plans that will identify priority locations for new sidewalks, cycling facilities and trails.



Improving access to health care by establishing a Colwood Clinic

Colwood is working to support community well-being by creating opportunities for social connection, recreation, and active living, but also by establishing a clinic to connect residents with a family physician.

In Colwood's Household Prosperity Survey the top issue for many residents is not having a doctor.

The business case confirms the existing clinic will connect 10,000 Colwoodians with a family physician by the fifth year of operation, with no ongoing impact on municipal tax funding.

The Colwood Clinic represents a new way of delivering care within the existing medical system, made possible by the Ministry of Health's innovative improvements to Longitudinal Family Practice in 2022.

Provincial revenues will flow through doctors to the clinic, allowing them to be paid as municipal employees with pension and benefits. Doctors car focus on care without having to run a business.

This is an opportunity to weave together the strengths of each level of government to do more than treat symptoms but to get to the roots of the social determinants of health.

Work continues on theWaterfront Walkway

Although it's mostly behind the scenes, work on a walkway between the Lagoon Bridge and The Beachlands continues in partnership with local Nations to ensure the pathway restores and enhances protection of the sensitive ecology and archaeology of the area.

Royal BC Museum's Archives, Research & Collections in Colwood

The new facility on Metchosin Road in Colwood will welcome visitors to learn more about the history of our province and foster connections between people, culture, and place. The beautifuly crafted, mass timber, energy

Protecting & growing

Abundant urban forest is one of Colwood's most cherished assets and defining qualities.

Living in Colwood we value trees for their beauty, as well as the health, environmental, social, and economic benefits they offer.

People in Colwood also recognize the need for transportation improvements, new housing, shops, and services, which often impacts trees. A resident's home renovation to add a suite, an intersection upgrade, a transit improvement, or creating safe ways for kids walking to school may all require tree removal.

Colwood is working to find a balance between these priorities by creating an Urban Forest Strategy with input from community members.

INTERSECTION UPGRADES

Wale & Wilfert

This intersection will see increased use with the completion of a new 300-unit apartment on Wilfert Road which is funding 74% of the upgrade. A BC Active Transportation Grant of \$208k will cover most of the remaining cost.

The intersection will be signalized in all directions, and will include a new diagonal shared crossing for Galloping Goose trail users. Bike lanes and conflict zones will be clearly painted, and bike lane protection will be added. The sidewalk will be extended along Wilfert Road, and turning movements will be improved for larger vehicles. Details at: www.Colwood.ca/WaleWilfert

Cairndale & Veterans

The 2015 Transportation Master Plan identified this intersection for upgrade to align with increasing traffic volume. Plans are now being advanced for 2025.

Options for both a traffic signal and a roundabout have been explored, considering traffic volume, safety, pedestrian and cycling use, land required and available, elevation changes, sight lines, entry angles, and costs.

A roundabout would require acquisition of land, retaining walls, and road realignment.

A traffic signal in this location presents fewer technical hurdles and will be more accommodating for pedestrians and cyclists, providing a better overall experience overall. Details at: www.Colwood.ca/Cairndale

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
